

Lakota Immersion Program

The Lakota immersion - mentorship program for Creighton University administration, faculty and staff. The immersion trip includes working with Lakota high school students who are preparing for college, visiting historical and cultural sites on the Pine Ridge and Rosebud reservations, and dialogue with Lakota students currently enrolled at Creighton as well as with other Lakota living on the reservations. Creighton University administration, faculty and staff work with students at Red Cloud High School, a Jesuit school on the Pine Ridge Reservation.



Red Cloud High School

Since 1999 Red Cloud High School has worked with thirty-nine Gates scholars in preparing Indian students for college. Thirty-two of those scholars received their scholarship since the Creighton University mentorship program began. The real heroes of this achievement are the students, families and teachers, both at Red Cloud and at other Native communities. Creighton University played a small but important part in this Gates Scholarship application process.
