New Employee Mission Orientations

Sending 4-5 person delegations to the Heartland-Delta annual weekend for conversation around the distinct nature of scholarship in Jesuit higher education. Creighton's 70 past participants have returned to share what they have received with campus colleagues.

Ignatian Colleagues Program

Forming the next generation of top leaders at Jesuit universities. This 18 month seminar has included 6 cohorts of Creighton participants, including four vice presidents, six deans, and four associate vice presidents.

Faculty Mission Fellowship

Designed in 2012 to develop a series of mentoring relationships between a junior (Fellow) and a senior (Mentor) faculty member. Eighteen faculty members are participating in the first two cohorts, from the College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Nursing and the Heider College of Business.

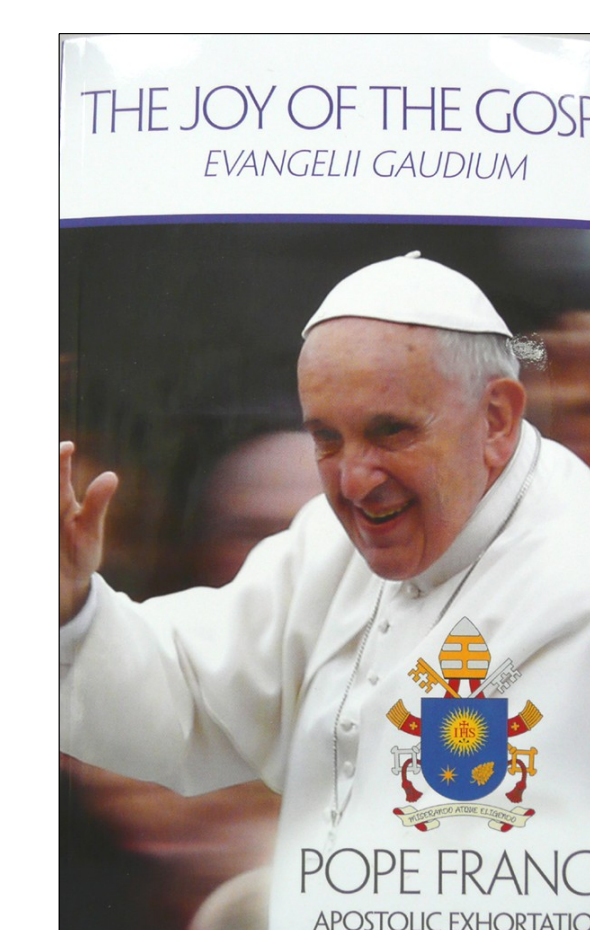
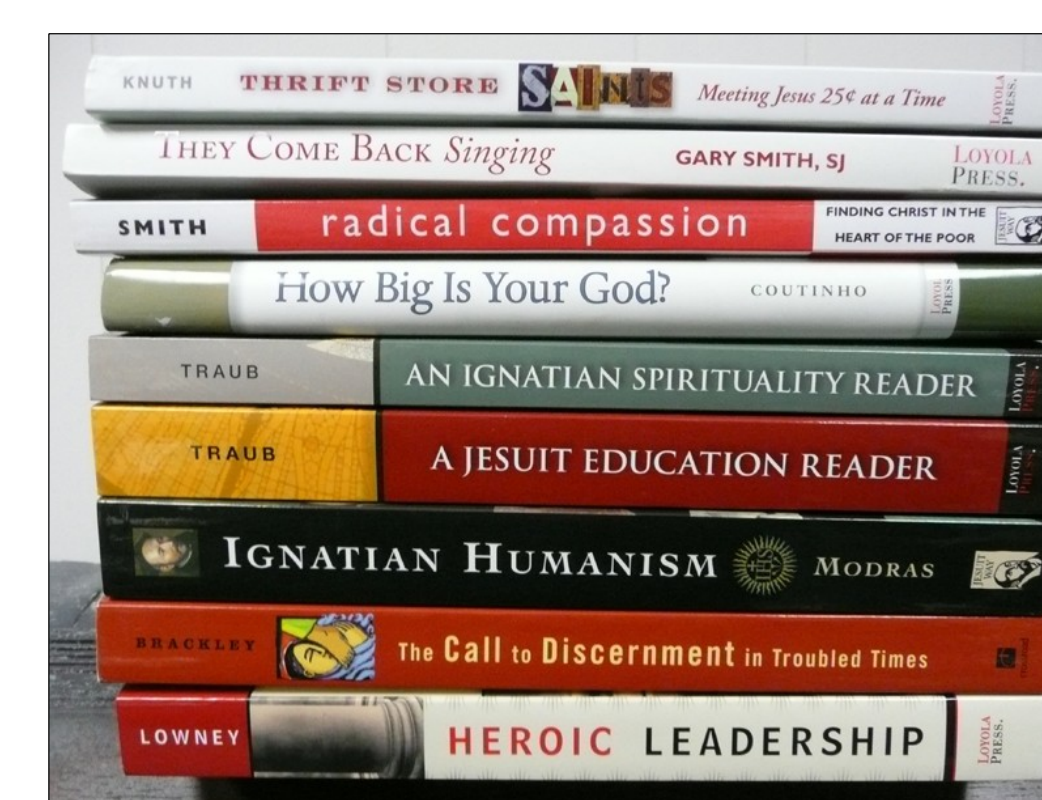

Leadership in Mission programs

Offering a series of "Managing to the Mission" seminars and follow-up sessions for mid-level administrators, across the campus. Also offering "Serving the Mission," workshops involving, for example, Pharmacy and Health Professions, Student Life and the Purchasing Department.

Around 200 faculty and staff have made the Online Retreat, experiencing the movements of the Spiritual Exercises. For the 2013-14 year, 73 members of the Creighton community are making the retreat individually.
