Mission in Action

Annually, Magis Catholic Teacher Corps prepares 25-30 talented college graduates from across the country to teach in Catholic schools in Nebraska, South Dakota and Kansas, where they spend two years modeling lives of faith and service to the students in their classrooms.

Magis, a Latin term meaning “the more,” is the charism of the Society of Jesus that embodies St. Ignatius’ question in his Spiritual Exercises: “*What more can I do for Christ?*” Magis teachers respond to this question by exploring a vocation in Catholic education.
