The School of Dentistry has a reputation for excellence

- · August 2018 marked the opening of a brand new state-of-the-art 200,000-plus square-foot dental facility
- There were 2,065 applicants for 115 available seats in 2019
- Faculty serve on local, regional and national boards and associations
- The dental clinic provides exceptional training and vital community service, serving more than 14,000 active patients
- · Creighton has nationally competitive dental research programs in oral biology

Our students are exceptional and diverse

- Creighton offers Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education (WICHE) seats for dental students from New Mexico and North Dakota
- Creighton is a dental pipeline school for Native American students interested in dentistry and is among the top 3 schools in the country educating Native American dentists. Creighton graduated the first American Indian dentist in the nation in 1956.
- Contracts with Idaho (IDEP) and Wyoming (WYDENT) provide a guaranteed number of seats for students from those states
- First-year students in 2019-2020 are from 30 states, 9 countries and 1 U.S. territory

They find technology-rich, interdisciplinary opportunities

- The Maxillofacial Imaging Center consolidates two Cone-Beam Computerized Tomography (advanced digital dental radiography) units
- The Wilwerding-DiLorenzo Digital Technology Center (CEREC lab) contains 40 acquisition units and 22 milling units
- The Master of Science in Oral Biology is a collaborative interdisciplinary program with the College of Arts and Sciences
- Extramural research funding totaled nearly \$1.5 million for 2018-2019 research
- The Mutual of Omaha Collaborative Care Center Suite coordinates patient care across health sciences disciplines, in collaboration with our College of Nursing and School of Medicine

- Students and faculty provide care to the underserved through the following outreach efforts:

 Community Health Center in Columbus and Fremont, Nebraska, and Community Action Partnership of

- Creighton's Healthy Smiles elementary school program provided preventive dental services for approximately 2,500 children this past year
- Community-based dental education extends its training to long-term facilities, senior centers and adult day care centers to provide collaborative special care training and opportunities for service in the Jesuit tradition
